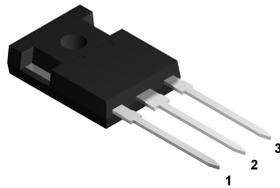
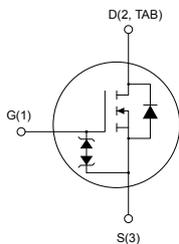

Description

This high-voltage N-channel Power MOSFET is part of the MDmesh DM6 fast-recovery diode series. Compared with the previous MDmesh fast generation, DM6 combines very low recovery charge (Q_{rr}), recovery time (t_{rr}) and excellent improvement in $R_{DS(on)}$ per area with one of the most effective switching behaviors available in the market for the most demanding high-efficiency bridge topologies and ZVS phase-shift converters.

Figure 1. Safe operating area

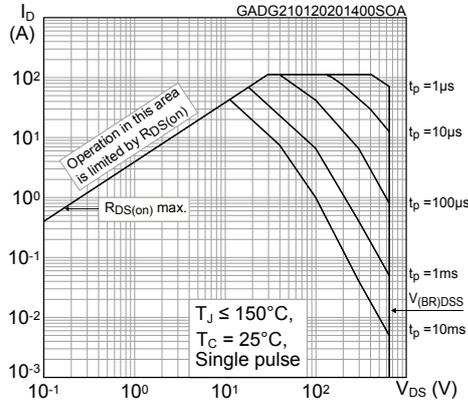


Figure 2. Maximum transient thermal impedance

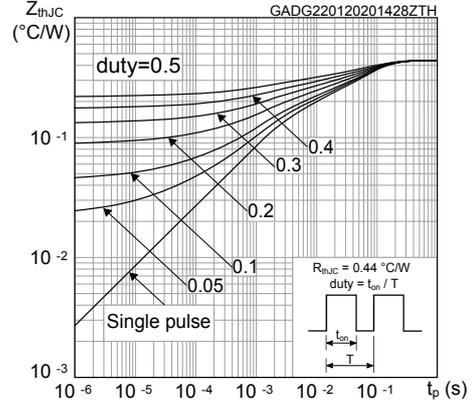


Figure 3. Typical output characteristics

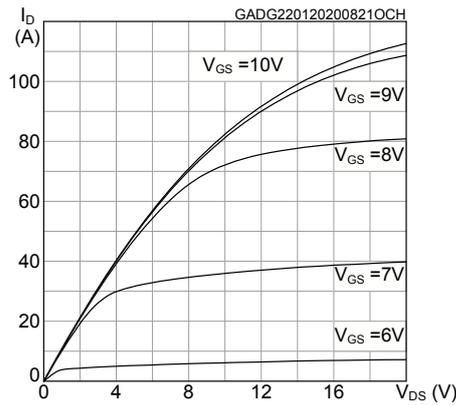


Figure 4. Typical transfer characteristics

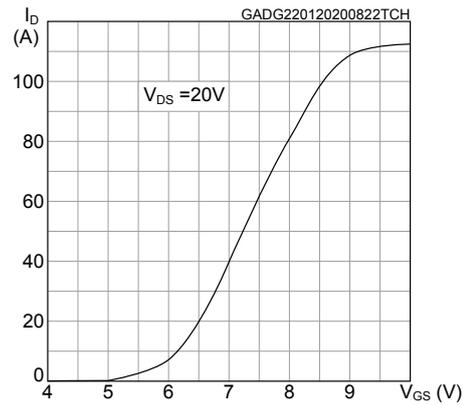


Figure 5. Typical drain-source on-resistance

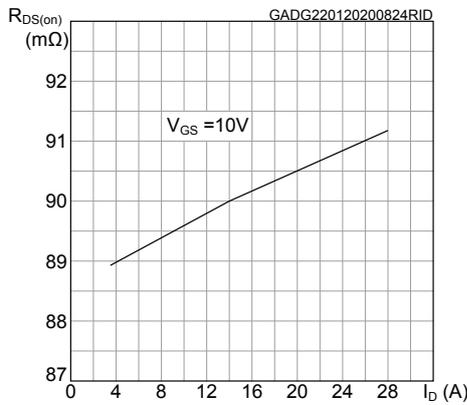


Figure 6. Typical gate charge characteristics

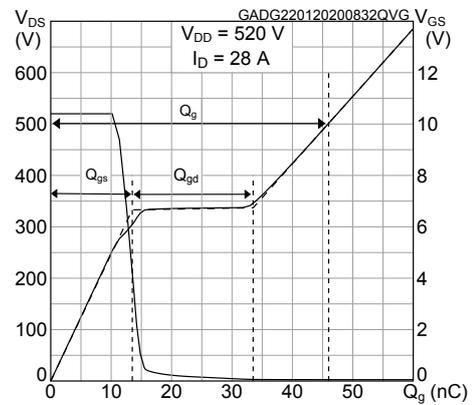


Figure 7. Typical capacitance characteristics

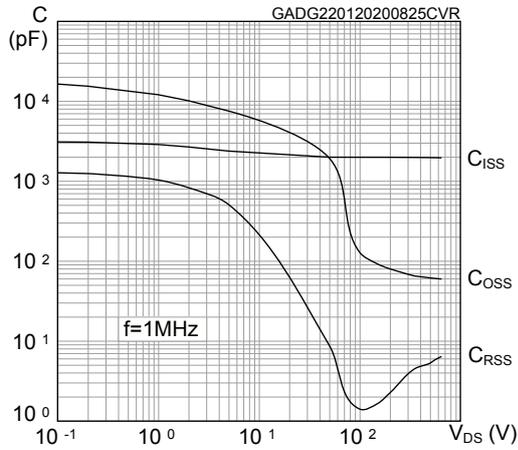


Figure 8. Normalized gate threshold vs temperature

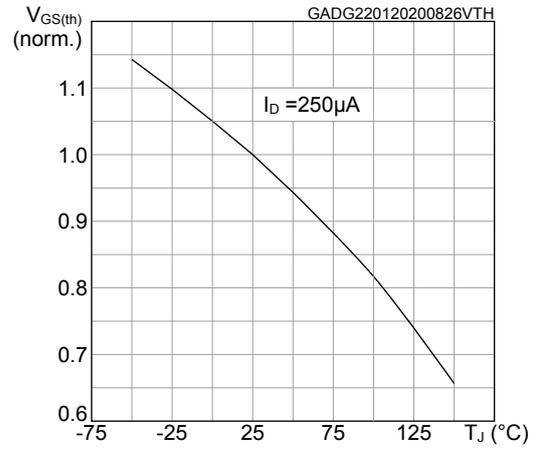


Figure 9. Normalized on-resistance vs temperature

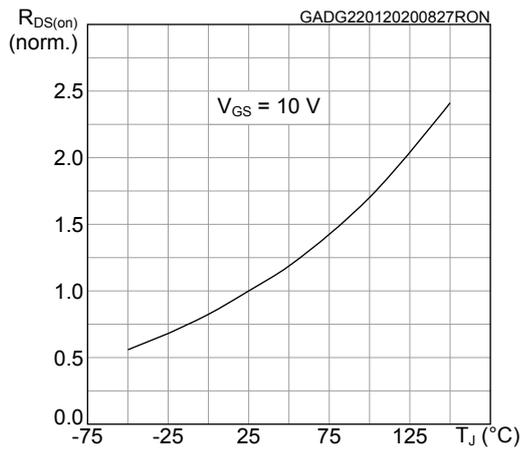


Figure 10. Typical output capacitance stored energy

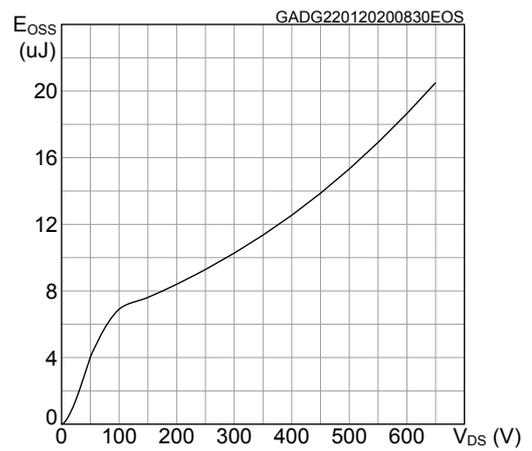


Figure 11. Normalized breakdown voltage vs temperature

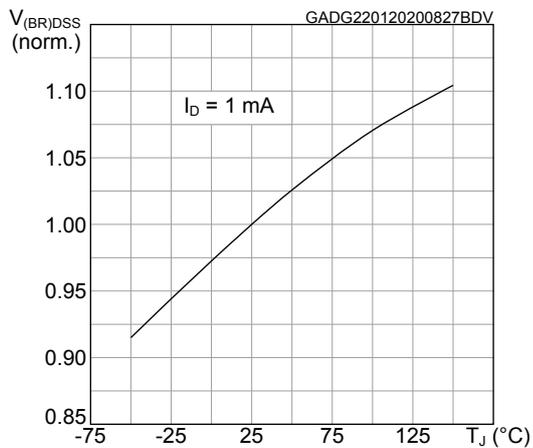
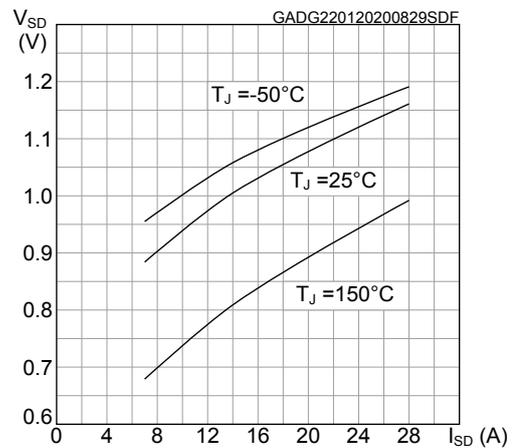
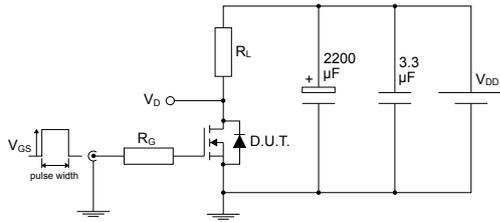


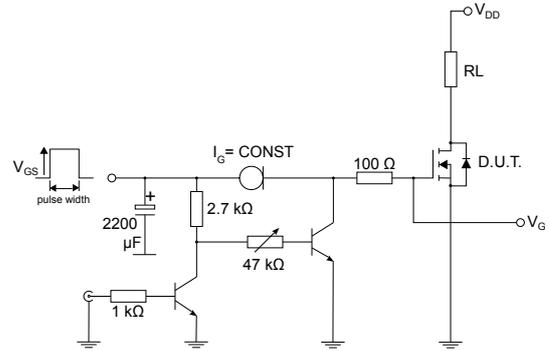
Figure 12. Typical reverse diode forward characteristics



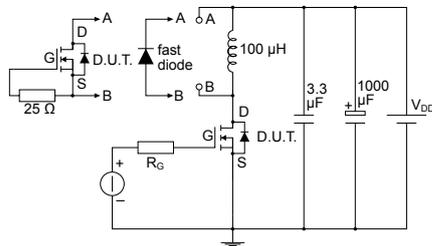

Figure 13. Test circuit for resistive load switching times


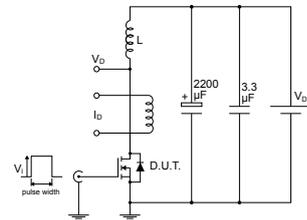
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Figure 14. Test circuit for gate charge behavior


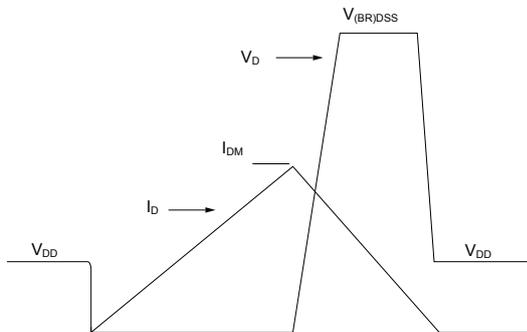
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Figure 15. Test circuit for inductive load switching and diode recovery times


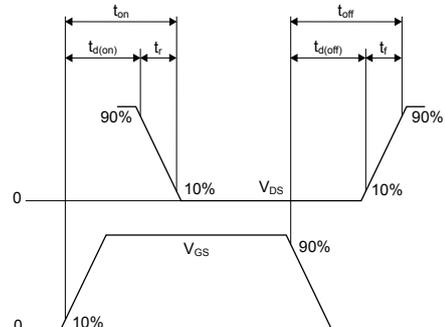
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Figure 16. Unclamped inductive load test circuit

Figure 19. TO-247 long leads package outline

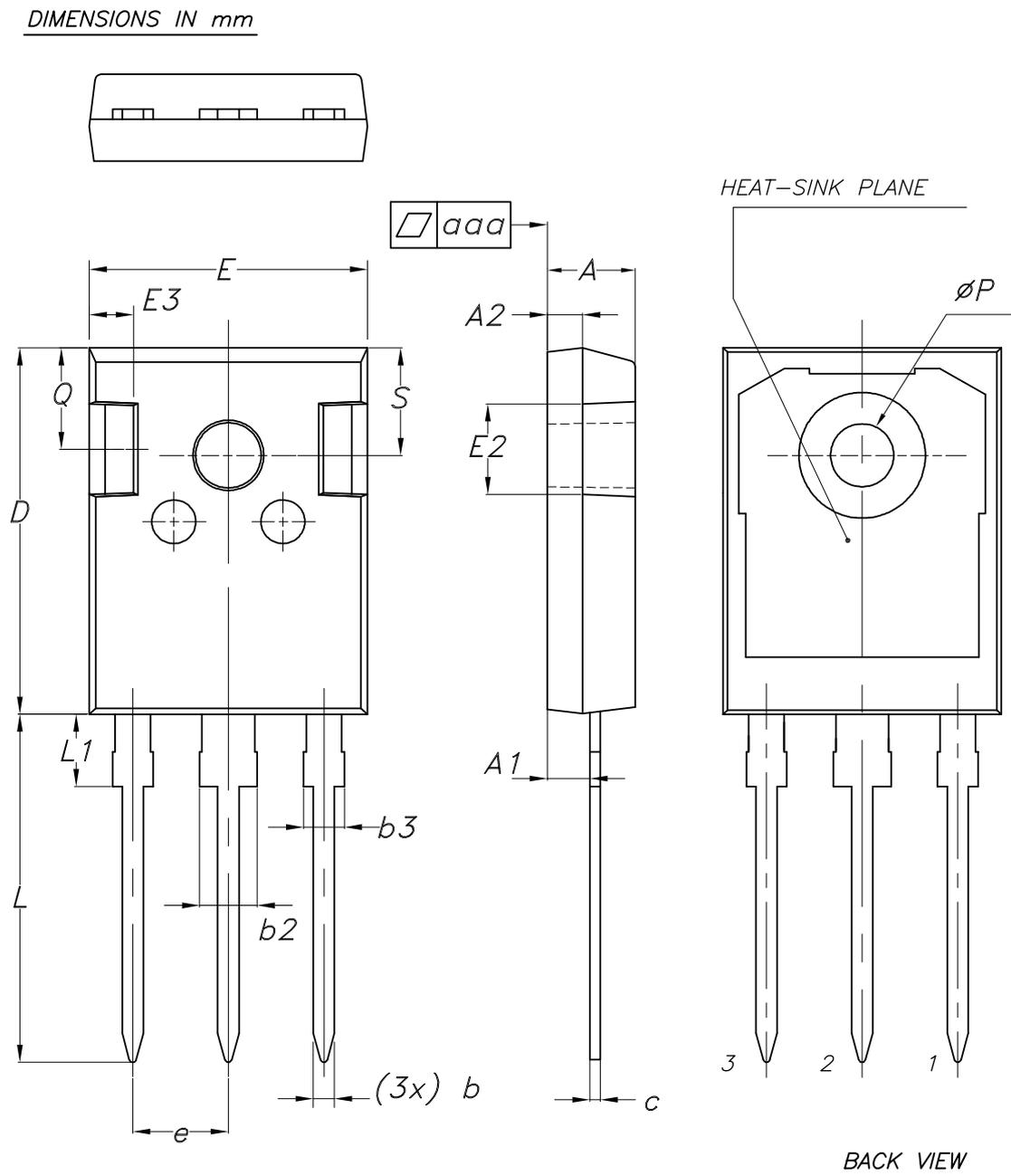
